

Significant Dates in History!

In 1870, April was a busy month! After an organizational meeting February 3, 1870 to establish “The First German Evangelical Lutheran Immanuel Congregation of Seymour, Indiana,” Henry Buse, Ephraim Ahlbrand, and John Rapp were elected as trustees of the new congregation. They were instructed to look about immediately for a church-building site, as well as to draft the proper constitution. On April 3, 1870, a constitution was submitted, adopted, and signed by the eleven original founders and several others, making the following men charter members of the church: Nicolaus Deppert, John Deppert, John Rapp, Andrew Voegt, Andrew Reichel, Louis Messer, George Schad, Jacob Hotzel, Ephraim H. Ahlbrand, Martin Ahlbrand, Wm. Ahlbrand, Wm. Buehner, John Mascher, J.H. Schepman, G.H. Hallow (Harlow), J.F. Bettenbrock, and H. Buse. The trustees were instructed to buy the lot of the southwest corner of Poplar and Oak Streets at the price offered, \$25.00, which was completed April 14, 1870.

Due to restrictions in gathering, the quarterly meeting scheduled for April 19 has been postponed indefinitely.


Stained Glass Window Progress
