A Gradual Return

Part of the plan to emerge from restrictions on gathering for worship and business is trusting people to make decisions that work best for them. If stores and churches are closed, no one can choose to go. If they are open, each person can decide whether they are ready to go or not.

The Elders and Trustees reviewed surveys returned by members and the guidance provided by the Governor in preparing a plan to resume in-person worship. Immanuel is blessed with members who can make good decisions about when they are ready to return.

If you have any symptoms of fever, cough, or sneezing, or have underlying health issues, we encourage you to worship from home for now. We will continue live-streaming and broadcasting services for those who cannot or choose not to attend in person.

Worship Changes for Now:

In keeping with recommendations, key changes for now include using every-other pew to provide distance between worshippers (we know people have their own pews, and look forward to when they can get it back!), printing everything in the bulletin so as not to share hymnals, not passing bulletins, registration pads, or offering plates, adding hand-sanitizers, and changing the process for Communion. Frequently Asked Questions Reopening Immanuel Lutheran Church Sanctuary

The Elders approved certain temporary changes in Immanuel's services in keeping with guidelines to protect the health of individuals and the community. Here are some of them:

- Q: Will there be "physical distance" for worshippers? A:Yes, we will use only every-other row. Overflow seating is in the Fellowship Hall.
- Q: Will the church bus be running? A:No, not at this time.
- Q: What other steps are taken to protect those who gather? A: There are several important changes, including:
- Doors will be propped open before and after services and all door handles will be sanitized before and after each service
- Hand-sanitizers have been placed around the sanctuary.
 - All bulletins include hymns and liturgy, so hymnals are not used. Bulletins will be already where you may sit, instead of being passed out. Please take them home with you, since we will not reuse them.
- We will not pass the attendance register.
- Ushers will not pass the offering plate but will have it on a table at the exits.
- Pews will be sanitized before and after each service.
- We will not have greeters to begin with.
- Pastors will not greet after the services.
- Ushers will help people find seats and dismiss worshippers to avoid crowding.
- If there is a children's message, children will stay with their families.
- O: Can I wear a mask? A: Yes. It is not required, but you are welcome to do so.
- O: Will we be serving Holy Communion?
- A: Yes. However, there will be changes to how it is offered for now to respect physical distancing and extraordinary precautions for sanitization:
- We will have two stations in front of the Communion rail in the sanctuary and one in the • chapel for "continuous serving" rather than gathering around the rail
- You are welcome to use one of the hand sanitizers on your way to Communion
- Those serving the bread will be 6-8 feet from those distributing the cups
- We will use only the individual cups for now
- Elders preparing Communion will not touch the bread with their hands and will use masks and one-time only latex gloves to place the cups in the trays for filling
- Those serving will sanitize their hands publicly before serving
- The host will be dropped (not placed) into the open hands of the communicant
- Cups will be placed on a table for the communicant to pick up to avoid contact
- Cups will be disposed of in the receptacle provided
- Individuals will come up the side aisles and return the center aisle, directed by the ushers according to family groups, who will keep separation
- The blessing will be provided to all communicants at the end of Communion
- The blessing of children will be done without touching them
- How long will these changes be in place? 0:
- A: We will review them and change them when it seems safe to do so.
