New Stained-Glass Window Installed!

On Tuesday, workers from Butler-Vargo in Indianapolis installed an additional bay of stained-glass windows on the south side, leaving just two to go before the project is completed. It was sponsored by Brent and Sandy Kilgas in honor of their parents, Delbert and Marlis Kilgas and Melvin and Emy Lou Wischmeier.

It portrays Jesus who at the age of 12 came with His family to Jerusalem and was found teaching the teachers in the Temple! (Luke 2:41-50) He told his family that He must be about His Father's business. The panel to the left portrays scribes and teachers in the Old Testament reading a scroll that points to Jesus.

The right panel shows how generations since have found Jesus revealed in the Bible, for Jesus says the Scriptures testify to Him (John 5:39). The background wooden beams resemble those in our present sanctuary, where we gather to listen to Him. The symbol on the left is a Menorah, which was used in the Temple to show God's presence (Exodus 37:17). The symbol of the crown on the right identifies Christ as one who is King, worthy of our worship and service (Rev. 1:5, and 11:15).


The quarterly meeting of the Voters Assembly is to take place Sunday, October 17 at 7:00 in the Fellowship Hall. among items on the agenda:
