Sign Up for Free Anniversary Banquet

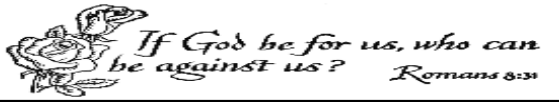
