THE INVOCATION

WHAT WE BELIEVE ABOUT HOW GOD FORGIVES

- L: What is the Office of the Keys?
- C: **The Office of the Keys is that special authority which Christ has given to His Church on earth to forgive the sins of repentant sinners, but to withhold forgiveness from the unrepentant as long as they do not repent.**
- L: Where is this written?
- C: **This is what St. John the Evangelist writes in chapter twenty: "The Lord Jesus breathed on His disciples and said, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone His sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven'" (John 20:22-23).**
- L: What do you believe according to these words?

C: I believe that when the called ministers of Christ deal with us by His divine command, in particular when they exclude openly unrepentant sinners from the Christian congregation and absolve those who repent of their sins and want to do better, this is just as valid and certain, even in heaven, as if Christ our dear Lord dealt with us Himself.

L: Let us confess our sins to God.

C: Merciful God, we have sinned in our thoughts, words, and actions. Not only have we done what is wrong, but we have failed to do what is right. We have neglected the means of grace, and have not loved our brothers and sisters as we ought. For the sake of Jesus Christ, forgive us and renew us. Empower us by Your Holy Spirit to live for Your glory and to serve others.

L: God is merciful! He sent His Son into this world to be made sin for us. In His death and glorious resurrection, He provided forgiveness for us and by the power of the Holy Spirit He restores us to His family. By Christ's command, it is my privilege, as a called and ordained servant of the Word, to forgive you all your sins in the Name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

L: Let us pray. O God, on this day You once taught the hearts of Your faithful people by sending them the light of Your Holy Spirit. Grant us in our day by the same Spirit to have a right understanding in all things and evermore to rejoice in His holy consolation; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

C: Amen.

THE WORD OF THE MONTH: (We speak together) **"I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me."** - John 10:14

THE OLD TESTAMENT READING: Numbers 11:24-30

So Moses went out and told the people the words of the Lord. And he gathered seventy men of the elders of the people and placed them around the tent. Then the Lord came down in the cloud and spoke to him, and took some of the Spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders. And as soon as the Spirit rested on them, they prophesied. But they did not continue doing it. Now two men remained in the camp, one named Eldad, and the other named Medad, and the Spirit rested on them. They were among those registered, but they had not gone out to the tent, and so they prophesied in the camp. And a young man ran and told Moses, "Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp." And Joshua the son of Nun, the assistant of Moses from his youth, said, "My lord Moses, stop them." But Moses said to him, "Are you jealous for my sake? Would that all the Lord's people were prophets, that the Lord would put his Spirit on them!" And Moses and the elders of Israel returned to the camp. **L:** This is the Word of the Lord. **C: Thanks be to God!**

THE SECOND READING: Acts 2:1-21

When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance. Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. And they were amazed and astonished, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians—we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others mocking said, "They are filled with new wine." But Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and give ear to my words. For these men are not drunk, as you suppose, since it is only the third hour of the day. But this is what was uttered through the prophet Joel "And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and

your old men shall dream dreams; even on my male servants and female servants in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy. And I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and vapor of smoke; the sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the day of the Lord comes, the great and magnificent day. And it shall come to pass that everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.” L: This is the Word of the Lord. C: **Thanks be to God!**

THE GOSPEL: John 7:37-39 C: Glory be to You, O Lord.

On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and cried out, “If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, ‘Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.’” Now this he said about the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were to receive, for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

L: This is the Gospel of the Lord. C: **Praise be to You, O Christ!**

WHAT WE BELIEVE ABOUT PRAYER

L: What privilege and command does God give to those who believe in Jesus?

C: **God commands and invites believers in Jesus Christ to pray.**

L: What is prayer?

C: **Prayer is speaking to God in words and thoughts.**

L: To whom should we pray?

C: **We should pray to the true God only, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, not to idols, saints, or anything God has created.**

L: What should be the content of our prayers?

C: **In our prayers we should ask for everything that tends to the glory of God and to our own and our neighbor’s welfare, both spiritual and bodily blessings. We should also praise and thank God for who He is and what He has done.**

L: How should we pray?

C: **We should pray in the Name of Jesus, that is, with faith in Him as our Redeemer; with confidence, that is with firm trust that for Jesus’ sake our prayers will be answered; and according to God’s revealed will.**

L: Who helps us pray?

C: **God the Holy Spirit prays with and for us.**

L: How does God answer prayer?

C: **God hears the prayers of all Christians and answers in His own way and at His own time.**
